Coffee With Class

The Coffee Class opened their doors just this past August and have been creating quite a stir in the community ever since. With a mission statement claiming the experience to be, “a highlight in your day by providing exceptional coffee with world-class service in an inspiring and nurturing culture.” We knew we had to check it out for ourselves.

Walking in the ambiance is very inviting, with an open floor plan and a natural wood bar framing the perimeter. The space is posh with modern accents and organic décor. Enjoy an incredible Single-Origin-Cup of coffee, poured over by hand, and brewed to order just for you at the proper temperature or perhaps a glass of their frothy, creamy, Nitro-Cold Chai Latte.

We had the opportunity to speak with Kyle Cunningham, owner of The Coffee Class to hear how this brand started and where they're heading!

What sets this coffee shop apart from the pack?

“We don't seek to simply copy what has al-

ready been done. We seek a higher standard, innovation, and creativity.”

How did this idea of The Coffee Class come to fruition?

“The need for specialty coffee in a relaxing space. As a local from the Henderson area I used to drive 30 minutes across town to get a decent cup of coffee. I knew I wanted to create a space that was great for working professionals and those just looking for a great meeting spot with friends and most importantly enjoy quality coffee while doing so. It's a labor of love, I spent 4 years developing the concept and building the right team around me to execute it.”

Where does your passion for coffee come from?

“It connects people in a way that few other products do. I think the energy from a great latte, a truly exceptional cup of coffee, sharing it with friends; it all makes it a great place to be and even work in. Coffee Class will always be a feeling, that's why I designed the space the way that I did. How does it make you feel when you walk in the door?”

Why the name The Coffee Class?

“I wanted to be different. I wanted to create a more sophisticated space that was classy but still relaxing to be in. I also wanted to make

sure we focused our brand on educating or customers on coffee. Talking about different types, things the normal person doesn't know about coffee, and single origin coffee which is something you don't see in most coffee shops. Eventually we will have actual classes and coffee “cuppings” which is basically like what wine tasting is just with coffee! In the future we'll also be a training hub for other coffee shops which is our long term goal. To become a leader and a resource in the coffee industry.”

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You can't always be lucky at the tables or the machines. Sometimes the money runs out before the weekend does—we've all been there. But rather than crawl off to your hotel room to lick your wounds and watch movies, you might look around our city to find attractions that are mostly or completely free. Some of these you might already know, others are bit more obscure. In any event, explore and enjoy!

Bellagio Fountains

Anyone who's seen Ocean's 11 knows the fountains. They're huge, beautiful and set to music. The show happens every 30 minutes in the afternoon and early evening, every 15 minutes from 8 pm to midnight. Great photo op. But you may not be aware of –

Bellagio Botanical Gardens and Conservatory – across the lobby from the front desk is the Conservatory. The horticulture staff creates a new living wonderland 5 times a year, one for each season and one for Chinese New Year. Paths and flowers and water features and trees – you could spend half a day here. More photo ops. By the way, before you enter the Conservatory, look up. Those aren't flowers on the ceiling – it's a giant glass sculpture by Chihuly: "Fiori de Como". There's art everywhere at the Bellagio.

Fremont Street Experience

Most people are aware that Old Vegas didn't really go away, it just got a face lift and a killer light show and re-branded itself as the Experience. It still boasts some of the



best restaurants in town, free concerts on the three stages on the street and the drinks are cheaper than the Strip. Fremont Street is like a huge, interactive circus all year round. It's a great place for people-watching. But there even more things hiding in the corners.

Backyard Playground at the Gold Spike

A family-friendly hangout during the day, it transforms into a nightlife venue after dark. Drinks are not free, of course, but the over-size games (chess, JENGA, LEGOs, Twister, etc) are free to play. Live music Thur – Sun,

Rollerskate Night is every third Wednesday of the month.

Container Park

Just south of the Experience on Fremont Street is Container Park, a nationally famous architectural experiment using shipping containers to build shops, restaurants, even a tree house. Bring the kids – there's a playground, free concerts and lots to do. Of course, there's also the fire-breathing praying mantis out front... Container Park is surrounded by individual sculptures, murals and art displays, but if art is your thing, you might be surprised to learn that Vegas has a monthly art celebration/market called –

First Friday

Centered at Charleston Blvd and S Casino Center Blvd, the first Friday of each month becomes a festival of art, music, food and culture for the aesthetically curious. Most of the action happens after dark, with street performers, art displays, booths and a fleet of food trucks to satisfy all your cravings. And if you can't make it on a First Friday, there are lots of galleries, restaurants, theatres and antique shops within easy walking distance. It's a nice break from the hustle and glitz of the Strip.

Pinball Hall of Fame

Currently on Tropicana Ave, moving soon to the Strip. If you're a fan of old-style arcade pinball, this is the place to be. If you want to play the machines, you can – and yes, they take quarters. Each day one machine is set to Free Play – see if you can find it.

If you're a fan of the Cirque shows, but just don't have the hundreds to shell out for another theatrical extravaganza, here's a couple of ideas:

The Magical Technical Tour – every Saturday at 1 pm, the Beatles LOVE show by Cirque de Soleil at the Mirage opens the doors for a half hour insider's tour of this popular show.

KA Open House – at MGM Grand, provides an up-close view of how the production team creates their incredible shows. Two tours on Tuesdays, two on Saturdays.

Mystere Rehearsal

Treasure Island, Saturdays from 3 to 3:30 pm, watch cast members from the show go through their paces, rehearsing for the evening performance.

All shows and times subject to change or cancellation without notice, call the box office to see if the show is still on.

Other free shows include:

Streetmosphere at the Venetian – strolling actors and singers replicate Renaissance Venice in the Grand Canal Shoppes; Lake of Dreams at the Wynn – a nightly laser light show with music, holography and puppets; Circus Acts at Circus Circus – daily, every half hour from 11 am to midnight; the Aquarium at Silverton Hotel and

Casino – this huge saltwater fish tank is home to thousands of fish, sharks, rays and ocean plants, with interactive feeding demonstrations and a mermaid show. Or, if you're into wildlife exhibits, check out the Flamingo Habitat at...you guessed it, The Flamingo Hotel and Casino.

But seriously, what is more quintessentially Las Vegas than lounge acts?

Harrah's Piano Bar, for instance has a regular act called "Dueling Pianos" – two pianists try to outperform each other, with audience input; Harrah's also has "Fat Elvis" – considered by many to be the best Elvis impersonator in town. How Vegas is that? Check the website or the box office for show times.

Brooklyn Bowl – one of the city's premiere concert venues also has free dance parties and concerts. And you can bowl a few games while you're there. Check their calendar for last minute changes in the lineup.



Indigo Lounge at Bally's – a swank lounge designed by Victor Drai, has free music and acts from 5 pm to 2 am nightly.



dishes inspired by their cultures.

Chef D'Andre Balaoing grew up in a military family and was fortunate enough to live in some of the most remote places in the world! By age 9 he lived in over 6 different countries like; Japan, Korea and Portugal. After leaving one place for the next, D'Andre pined for the foods he tasted. As a result, his food always aims to conjure memories of nostalgia, making him a multicultural chef. He blends his Filipino and Asian heritage with

American soul food techniques to bring fun, innovative dishes to every table. After graduating from UNLV in 2015, he was casted for season 7 of FOX's "Master Chef" and was named one of America's top home cooks by Gordon Ramsay.

Today he works as a pastry chef at the cosmopolitan and has been featured all over the world as a guest chef and consultant. If you have faith in him, he can promise a tasty experience possibility infused with cannabis that you'll never forget. ■

Cannabis Infused Ice Cream Recipe

The perfect accompaniment to your holiday apple pie or great when served alone, and topped with chocolate sauce or fruit compote. This gelato recipe can be scaled with more or less THC, to your liking; but I prefer to keep it light at 5 grams, for everyone to enjoy. This recipe yields a creamy, rich vanilla flavor, but can be flavored with spices or other add-ins, if you'd like.

Infused Cream (Ingredients)

- 2 cups heavy cream
- 5 grams marijuana, ground
- 1 vanilla bean, scraped

Directions

1. Combine all ingredients in a medium saucepan, and simmer gently for one hour, do not boil.
2. Strain the mixture through a fine mesh strainer or cheesecloth, and chill.

Infused Ice Cream (Ingredients)

- 1 ½ cups infused cream
- 4 cups milk
- ¾ cup dry milk powder
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 1 tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp xanthan gum

Directions

1. In a medium saucepan combine; infused cream, milk, dry milk powder, and xanthan gum; bring to a simmer, and whisk to dissolve the milk powder and xanthan gum.
2. In a mixing bowl, whisk: eggs, sugar, and salt until frothy to form a base. The sugar may not completely dissolve— this is okay.
3. Carefully add ¾ cup of the hot infused mixture to the egg base, whisking to avoid cooking. This will temper the egg yolks, to thicken the base.
4. Once combined, pour everything back into the saucepan, and cook over low heat until a thick custard is formed, or mixture reaches 170 degrees.
5. Strain mixture through a fine mesh strainer, or blend on a low setting with a blender, chill until cold.
6. Churn the ice cream with an ice cream machine or let freeze in a resealable freezer bag in the freezer.

Elyza Aka The Blazed chef Born in San Diego California now living in Las Vegas Nevada has been cooking since she was 17. Her Filipino and Italian roots play a huge role in her dishes, but she loves to cook just about everything. She started cooking with cannabis about 5 years ago. Although she did not go to culinary school she's been learning to cook ever since she was a little kid. From learning from her Filipino or Italian grandparents she's picked up a lot and it shows. You can book her for catering or just put in order with her if you want to try it out! You won't be disappointed. ■

Pancit Recipe

Ingredients

- 1 (12 ounce) package dried rice noodle
- 1 teaspoon vegetable oil
- 1 onion finely diced
- 3 cloves minced garlic
- 2 cups shredded chicken breast
- 2 cups cabbage thinly sliced
- 4 carrots thinly sliced 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 2 lemons

Directions

1. Place the rice noodles in a large bowl, and cover with warm water. When soft, drain, and set aside.
2. Heat oil in a wok or large skillet over medium heat.
3. Sauté onion and garlic until soft. Stir in chicken cabbage, carrots and soy sauce. Cook until cabbage begins to soften.
4. Toss in noodles, and cook until heated through, stirring constantly.
5. Transfer pancit to a serving dish and garnish with quartered lemons.



There were no Phillies, or Flyers or Eagles and for sure no 76ers. Here I was a TV anchor and reporter out of the number 4 market in the country now coming to the 156th market. I landed at KSHO TV 13 where there was myself and one other reporter a then young man who later would become a State Senator and a great friend Terry Care.


We were directed by two namesakes in the news business Darryl Dryer and Mal Harris. Let me tell you I never looked back. I knew Las Vegas would forever be my home. But it was the City that made this Home so special, and it was different from what it is today, so very different!

Back then Las Vegas was a “direction” community not a “neighborhood” community. What does that mean? You see back then you lived in the West, or the South, or the East. You lived in a direction. The town didn’t really have “neighborhoods” other than those who could afford the best like Rancho Circle or The Country Club. I, for instance, lived in the East. Why because I had two small sons and I learned where the best school in town was George E. Harris Elementary School. if you wanted your kids to have a solid education you lived in the neighborhood. We

did, but it seemed that anyone who was anything had their kids go there too. The PTA was the who’s who of Las Vegas.

But as I found out everything was “decentralized” located where the center of the action was. Heck Rainbow was a dirt road back then, there was nothing south of Sunset, There was no 95, 515 or anything like that. Rancho was your best bet to head North. Places to be seen included Chateau Vegas (and if your were lucky you were invited upstairs to be near the wise guys), The Alpine Village, best soup anywhere, The Venetian; Mama Ruvo only made the best, and The Flame, great burgers and steaks. There were also the “special” places to enjoy like The Castaways that had the most incredible \$1.99 Prime Rib anywhere, The Silver Slipper; To-

row the diet Today the Buffet, the Vineyard; Just a cool place for pasta. But there were others like the Cavalier, The Coachman, the Golden Steer and oh yes The Library. And let's not forget the best \$.99 cent Shrimp Cocktail at the Golden Gate downtown and my personal favorite the \$1.85 full steak dinner after 11:00pm in the coffee shop at Binions on Fremont. That steak almost cost me my job, let me explain!

As I said I was a news reporter/anchor and the rule I had lived by was no comps ever. Many evenings I would be hungry after work and my Mom lived with us so my wife would meet me at Binions at least once a week for "my" steak dinner. It was great, salad, steak, potatoe, vegetable and desert for \$1.85. The beef came from Benny Binion's own ranch. Each night I ate there I had to fight for my check, they would not give me one, but I would

win and pay the big \$6.00 for two including drink. One Friday night we go down for dinner and again the check fight but this time a Bnion's security Guard came to me and said "Mr. Binion would like to see you." I can tell you when Benny Binion asked to see you it was not good. The security guard then walked me through the casino to what I thought was Mr. Binion's office but instead we ended in the alley out back. I don't have to tell you what I thought. Mr. Binion said to me, "Mr. Schorr do you like Las Vegas, well if you don't stop being a jerk (sp) and accept us being nice to you it could all end for you." We will never ask favors or for you to do stories in a certain way, we just like you and you are now insulting us!" With that I said I was sorry, limited future steak dinners, but never "insulted" them again. Yes the town was small but it was different.

Today no more directions! Today there are neighborhoods. Places like

Downtown Summerlin, Centennial Hills, Aliante. All neighborhoods with more growing everyday. With the neighborhoods has also come great things like the Vegas Golden Knights, The Aces, The Aviators, Vegas Rollers and soon to be Las Vegas Raiders. And the growth has really just begun. Depending on who you talk to Major League Baseball and the NBA are just around the corner. The new hangouts include Andiron at Downtown Summerlin, Coffee at Coffee Bean and Tea Leaf at The District and any of the cool spots at Container Park Downtown not to mention the morning crowd at the Starbucks in Summerlin. Yes that is our own District Attorney there grabbing a cup with his favorite puppy. But it's good to have memories and places like Christ Church Episcopal. They still have their Lobster sales event each year, memories of the days gone by. Who knows you might go and see someone you met sitting next to you at The Alpine Village, you never know.

Las Vegas might be neighborhoods now but the best remains the people. From Mayor Carolyn and Oscar Goodman to Joe Brown and his great luncheons at The Country Club and all the greats in between. It all makes this community one in which I am proud to call home and Living Las Vegas Style still beats anything else I know. ■

The light show begins on Thanksgiving Day and continues through New Year’s Eve. The lights are activated each day at 6 PM and stay lit until 10 PM. You do not want to miss this incredible display with over 95,000 lights! Don’t forget to visit the House on Robindale’s official Facebook page.

They are famous for their holiday lighting displays on Halloween and Christmas. In fact, they add to their

Different Perspectives

Fascination of Circumstances

It is always fascinating to me how two different people can look at the same set of circumstances or same exact event and have two completely different perspectives. I have found that these perspectives come to pass for a myriad of reasons; personal experiences, public opinions, peer pressure, misunderstanding, bias...just to name a few.

I have experienced this many times in my life, but specifically when it came to one subject as I moved from one profession to another.

The subject? UNLV Football...

When I came to Southern Nevada in 1997, I was a young Sports Anchor early in the television industry looking to spend a few years in Las Vegas and then move on and move up with another opportunity in the biz somewhere else. I never dreamed that I would spend the rest of my television

career and then change careers here. Las Vegas has become my home.

I worked at KVBC-TV, the local NBC affiliate in Las Vegas, for 11 years. In that time I moved up to the Sports Director, was nominated for an Emmy, and won Sportscaster of the Year seven times. I learned this city and the sports landscape. I learned the history of an eclectic sports community and the passion of those who lived here about our local sports. I also learned the historic, storied and celebrated past of the UNLV Basketball program, in contrast to the lackluster, woeful and lamentable past of the UNLV Football program.

Over the last decade when I arrived in Las Vegas, UNLV had suffered through eight losing seasons, then won three games followed by a winless 0-11 campaign and the firing of a Coach. Since then, the Rebels have become bowl eligible only twice. Personal experience, public opinion, bias

and even some peer pressure should cause me to deduce that UNLV Football has failed.

Enter...perspective.

After a 14-year Television career, I felt God was leading me to another profession. I had an opportunity to leave the TV business and join a Sports Ministry called the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). This is a ministry that has been making a difference in the lives of coaches and athletes for more than 65 years around the country. I spent a career showing highlights every evening of teams that scored more points than another team and crowning them "successful" and the team coming up short "failures". Many times, the lead sports story of my sportscasts would be about how an athlete had messed up, made bad decisions, and ultimately "failed" in the public eye.

However...I gained perspective.

My transition to FCA allowed me to



focus on what these coaches and athletes were doing 'off' the field instead of just on. It caused me to truly see who these athletes were as individuals, with feelings, emotions, desires, dreams and fears. They became faces with hearts and souls instead of just uniforms with logos and team colors. Their efforts on the practice field and their competitive playing surfaces became more about their mindset, their motivation and their attitudes instead of what a final score or a stat line read at the end of a contest.

So, where does that leave me when perspective collides with UNLV Football?

The reality of personal experience, public opinion, peer pressure and bias would give the misunderstanding that UNLV Football has been a failure. Four winning seasons in my lifetime. Just two since I moved to Las Vegas in 1997. Many final scores have caused the mindset to be that this program has been mired in something south of mediocrity. However, I have been around this program for 22 years; ironically 11 covering the team to regurgitate scores and hilites,

and 11 behind the scenes serving as the team's Chaplain through FCA.

Author John Ortberg wrote that "failure is not an event, but rather a judgment about an event". My perspective on UNLV Football has graduated past a limited, narrow-minded view of success or failure based off final scores. My perspective has moved to a place that allows the possibility of looking inside the facemask at the face inside, the heart and soul underneath the jersey and logos, the life that is present when the player walks off the field, out of the locker room and into this journey called life. I have learned more than the statistics and the positions of each of the players on this team over the years. I have learned their names. I have learned what motivates them on and off the field. I have learned what their hopes and dreams and fears and doubts are. I have learned about their family life and where they have come from. I have held many hands amid tears when the team doctor accesses an injury and encouraged them that God has a plan in their storm. I have cried with and held players after the loss of

a loved one or after a teammate took his own life.

I have learned who these young men are, and I can promise you that despite any heckling or criticism that may fly at them from the stands or from the newspaper, everyone from the head coach to the last player on the bench...wants to be successful. However, everything hinges on how we CHOOSE to define success.

I choose to go with Super Bowl-winning Coach Tony Dungy from his book "Quiet Strength". He said, "God gives each one of us unique gifts, abilities, and passions. How well we use those qualities to have an impact on the world around us determines how "successful" we really are".

Yes, I also want UNLV Football to win. I want that for these coaches and players that work hard and strive for worldly success. But I also have the perspective to see the true success that so many of them have had through the men of influence and character that they became.

Perspective is a very interesting thing. ■

Cheers to the Longest Lasting Local Haunts

Where might a local hang out? Where are places, which have survived Las Vegas' fast-paced growth over the past 40 years? Longtime residents from the 70s and 80s continue to mourn the loss of many cherished hangouts such as Chateau Vegas, Café Michele, Tower of Pizza, and Alpine Village.

While those haunts are gone, a few hidden 24-hour spots remain or have been born. The most pristine in a time warp category exists in its original form on the Strip. The freestanding Peppermill Restaurant and Fireside Lounge opened Dec. 26, 1972, and was tucked for years between the Rivera Hotel and Casino, which has been torn down to make room for the Las Vegas Convention and Authority expansion, and Silver City Casino, which is now a Ross Dress

For Less store, and across the street from the Stardust Resort and Casino, which is becoming the Resorts World Las Vegas.

The Peppermill is two places in one. The front side facing the Strip is a restaurant, which at peak times especially for breakfast, which is served all day long, and lunch has folks waiting. It continues to serve oversized portions and many original menu items in a bright atmosphere with neon lights, fake trees, mirrored ceiling, and crescent-shaped booths. To say the least, this place is picture perfect. It's been the backdrop for many videos, TV shows and films like "Casino," "Showgirls," "The Cotton Club," "The Holly Madison Show," and "Giada at Home." It has also attracted famous visitors such as Dean Martin, Jerry Lewis, Guy Fieri, Criss Angel, Carrot Top, Mike Tyson, Floyd Mayweather, and Penn Jillette.

Many folks never venture into the back end of the building where there is an elongated neon-lit lounge with a memorable circular flaming refec-tion pool pit, bar and large roman-tic booths. In the old days when the town was small, this was a bar where a lot of folks hung out and made out between the foliage, and not always with a spouse. If the walls could only talk. The bar with gaming on top is sunken in back for the bartenders with short lounge chairs for seating rather than high top bar stools. Happy Hour is daily 3-6 p.m. There is a back door, used mostly by locals and plenty of parking.

Another place located on Las Vegas Blvd. further north near The Strat (formerly the Stratosphere and before that Vegas World) is a storied family-owned neighborhood dive bar called Dino's Lounge. Folks often believe it might be named after sing-



er and Rat Pack celeb Dean Martin, nicknamed Dino, and wonder if it was his hangout. The answer is no. It is named after its owner since 1960, Dean “Dino” Bartolo.

There’s nothing fancy at this place known as “the last neighborhood bar in Las Vegas.” It’s even smoky with a small stage where karaoke and live entertainment take place along with a big sign reading “Dino’s, getting Vegas drunk since 1962.” While the location appears a bit sketchy, the place has character with lively karaoke nights, pool tables and video poker. It’s a good place to meet locals and drinks are cheap.

The Dispensary Lounge, family-owned and operated since opening in 1976, is situated in a mall off Tropicana Ave. and Eastern Blvd. and hard to find. There are no windows, just a red door that leads inside to a set of challenging swinging doors before you get fully inside. If you wondered what décor looked like about 40-plus years ago, check this place out right down to the shag carpet and wagon wheel on the wall, which no longer turns. This 24-hour cozy hideaway has bar-top gaming, food and an acclaimed jazz series, which packs the place on select nights.

Fun note on this place, the day marijuana became legal in Nevada, the phone rang off the hook at The Dispensary Lounge only for callers to learn the place only served liquor, food and fun.

The next two locations by the same owner P Moss aren’t the oldest but

are “over-the-top,” which tends to be a good description of Las Vegas.

Near downtown just west of Interstate 15 on West Charleston is Frankie’s Tiki Room, which you can’t miss with the name shining in bright pink neon. Originally the place with a crescent-arch entryway was the ’50s-era Frankie’s Bar & Cocktail Lounge and Moss bought it when it went up for sale. He gutted the place to build an authentic tiki bar with tropical drinks, which was missing in town at the time after the Aku Aku at the Stardust and Don the Beachcomber at the Sahara Hotel and Casino closed in the ’80s. While he met challenges, 35 days after he got the keys to the place, he opened Frankie’s Tiki Room on Dec. 4, 2008. Another bar with a red door but embellished with a couple tiki totems.

For Moss, the place was serendipity. He was able to create a captivating exotic joint deeply rooted in tiki tradition, with modern primitivism and gambling at the bar – Las Vegas style. The authenticity was made possible when Moss got together with Bamboo Ben, the grandson of the legendary tiki pioneer Eli Hedley, who among his creations was the sculptor of Aku Aku’s landmark statuary. The assembled artists made furniture, wall coverings and wall decorations out of bamboo, 100-year-old tapa cloth, rattan, thatch and pufferfish. They even created tiki mugs unique to Frankie’s.

As luck would have it, Bamboo Ben, himself a tiki legend, was also a punk-

rock aficionado and fan of Moss’ other outlandish creation, the Double Down. This punk-rock place gives new meaning to indescribable. On the Double Down website, the bar is proudly referred to as the “clubhouse for the lunatic fringe.” In its nearly 30-year existence in an obscure location across from the Cox Pavilion on the University of Nevada Las Vegas campus, the Double Down has acquired a following the world over. Anthony Bourdain, Travel Channel’s Samantha Brown, and comedian Dave Attell are among celebrities who’ve helped expose this dive bar’s story.

The place top to bottom is covered with color swirling designs and murals with skeletons and half-dressed females. The bathrooms look like graffitied subway stops. The décor, an oxymoron, has an appearance of being possessed, possibly by Satan. Where else will you see handmade signs advertising drink specials involving Slim Jims and Twinkies and \$20 puke insurance, which may very well be needed. Guess it’s no surprise unusual drinks have been created here like “Ass Juice,” a drink which spawned shot glasses shaped like a miniature toilet and t-shirts, or the Bacon Martini, which garnered exposure on the “Today” show, BBC, and pages in the “New York Post.” The Double Down is also known as a breeding ground for alternative music and giving bands a break.

Visit any of these five haunts and you’ll have something to talk about with friends! ■

Budtender Awards





WISPAPALOOZA

Wireless Internet Service Providers

Chances are you've either never heard the term WISP, or if you have—in reference to the frame of a small child—a wisp of a boy—or the more archaic use; a small clump of straw used to groom horses. WISP is not either of those anymore, the middle-English term having given way to the modernized acronym age: Wireless. Internet. Service. Provider. “WISP”.

A WISP is a company who provides you and your residential or business neighbors internet. The stand-out difference between a WISP and an ISP is literally, the “W”. . . the wireless aspect of the internet age.

Typically, all internet provided to homes and businesses arrived at the modem from either DSL (internet over phone lines), Fiber Optics (too

expensive for most small businesses and homes), or CABLE (the same coaxial cable that provides you with cable TV). From that modem, it was the end user's (you) responsibility to either plug in a T10/100 ethernet cable from the modem to your PC, or purchase an additional wireless router to create a wireless internet environment for your handheld devices like phones and tablets.

WISP expanded on the typical model out of necessity. Rural areas like farms, and hard to reach areas like cabins or lodges, rarely have a high-speed internet infrastructure. For those out of the way places who needed internet, but were unable to afford miles of dedicated hardline cables, the WISP was born.

WISPs are usually small to mid-sized, family owned, local businesses. They purchase internet from giant providers and bring it to their home base. From there, the ISP becomes a WISP by setting up an

antenna miles and miles away to receive internet from home. Sometimes and at great financial burden, the WISP will pay for and bury cable from their home base to an area who needs a large amount of internet. Once the internet terminates at the new location the WISP then sets up antennas to broadcast wireless internet to the surrounding region.

The advantage to a WISP is their ability to scale up rapidly and can often meet or beat legacy wired systems like cable and telephone. Also, a WISP can go nearly anywhere.

WISPAPALOOZA is an annual WISP Convention where these business owners and infrastructure providers come together to share exciting news about this breakout industry. WISPAPALOOZA happened at the Rio in October. If you're looking for a WSIP in Las Vegas, LV.Net is your only provider and as good as they get.

A federal 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation and home to 32 lions, a giraffe, ostriches, and emus. The ranch strives to educate guests about their animals and how our community can take part in conservation. If you would like a more personal experience, they also offer a Behind the Scenes tours. This is a guided tour with one of their knowledgeable keepers early in the morning before they open to the public. They also offer educational field trips on Thursdays, Fridays, and Mondays every week from 9am-10am during summer hours. The Lion Habitat Ranch also actively contributes to conservation efforts for both lions and giraffes.








Have a Need for Speed? LasVegas.Net Late Model Truck Series Has You Covered

LasVegas.Net is proud to announce our new sponsorship of The Late Model Truck Series based out of Las Vegas, Nevada. This Premier West Coast Truck Touring Series has a long history in short track racing. Once known as the Speed Truck Series originated back in 1997, under the American Speed Association (ASA.) As a touring series, the Trucks raced up to 10 different tracks in one season, traveling through California, Arizona, and Nevada.

The Trucks go to local tracks, ranging from small 1/4-mile tracks to big 1/2-mile ovals, along with 1.7 and 2.1-mile road courses. Although the ASA Truck series disbanded in 2013, the remaining Trucks have regrouped and now race as the Late Model Truck Series. The LMTS Truck Series uses a full-tube chassis with a 330-horsepower sealed V-8 spec engine. They have a two-speed direct drive transmission, with a clutch pedal dump valve coupled to an aluminum quick-change rear end.

The trucks sport replica fiberglass bodies of the Chevrolet S-10, Chevrolet Colorado, Dodge Dakota, Ford Ranger and Toyota Tacoma. Speeds can reach up to 150-mph at some of the larger tracks!



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
